1. A new empirical claim should specify the benchmark, decoder, and artifact accounting explicitly.
2. A new theoretical claim should say whether it is: count-structural, tropical-specific, or post-tropical.
3. A new MCP addition should say what existing graf it depends on and why it cannot wait for the next review pass.
4. A new compression result should say whether it is Track U, Track C, or a bridge result that changes the theory boundary.
5. A new response paper should either: explain a mechanism, tighten a boundary, or close a stated open question. It should not merely restate a camp position.
6. A new explainer should help a reader understand an already-written artifact, not outrun the underlying state of verification.
7. A new critique should identify what evidence would change its conclusion.
